- Participating in discussions, analysis, document review, management, and execution of active transactions including reviewing due diligence and documentation during entire lifetime of a transaction
- Reviewing and analyzing on-going portfolio management issues and documents including waivers, amendments and potential impairment issues
- Assisting with development and execution of procurement solicitations and contracts

- Consulting and collaborating with NY Green Bank's Managing Director, Legal and Regulatory Affairs on material issues
- Performing other responsibilities as assigned
